### Williamsburg, Jamestown & Yorktown – The Historic Triangle

Tour Leader – Casey Koontz – October 7 - 9, 2025



Perhaps you visited this iconic area while in school. Here's your chance to revisit this location and hear the fascinating stories of many brave people who played a crucial role in the early development of the United States.

Our first stop will be in **Jamestown, the first English settlement in North America** which today is a museum of 17<sup>th</sup> century Virginia history and culture. After arriving we'll enjoy **lunch (included) from the café**, then receive a **tour of the Jamestown settlement** followed by time on your own where you'll discover the story of America's beginnings through outdoor re-creations, immersive films and gallery exhibits. After checking into the **Williamsburg Woodlands Hotel**, located inside Colonial Williamsburg, you'll be on your own for dinner at one of the many restaurants in Merchants Square. After dinner you'll be treated to a **Ghost Tour of Williamsburg**.

The following day will start with breakfast at the hotel then we'll meet our guide for a 2 ½ hour **walking tour of Colonial Williamsburg** followed by **free time to explore the Historic section** and have lunch on your own. In the evening we'll meet for **dinner (included) in the heart of the Old Colonial Village at Shields Tavern**.

Our final day after breakfast and checkout at the hotel we'll depart for a **guided tour of Yorktown**, then have time on your own to explore the area. You may choose to see the American Revolution Museum, indoor galleries featuring period artifacts and exhibits, films including "The Siege of Yorktown" and outdoor living-history areas, witness artillery demonstrations, drill with wooden muskets at a re-created Continental Army encampment or explore a Revolution-era farm.

## TRIPS TO REVIEW... *Won't you join us?*

### **LONG ISLAND, GOLD COAST AND HAMPTONS NEW YORK**

**Tour Leader – Joanne Kessler – June 24-27, 2025**

**We are going on this trip in June and I thank you for joining this great excursion!**

**TUES 7:30 AM LEAVE DAMASCUS** to begin our trip to downtown Riverhead, NY, which is the entrance to the “East End” of Long Island, known as South Fork.

2:30 PM We will check into the Hyatt Place Hotel for the next two nights. Located in downtown Riverhead on the Peconic River, adjacent to the Long Island Aquarium and features indoor and outdoor pools, a fitness center, and coffee and wine bar. There is time to explore downtown and/or the aquarium.

6 PM Dinner at *Jerry and the Mermaid*, which is walking distance from the hotel.

**WED** Continental Breakfast at the hotel. Meet your guide in the lobby. Start your day touring in the village of East Hampton, which has historic homes, museums, Main Street churches and mansions. Next step is Long Island’s eastern most point where the majestic Montauk Point Lighthouse stands. Built in 1792 by George Washington it is now the oldest operating in New York state, and the 4<sup>th</sup> oldest in the country. Climb the 137 steps to the top and enjoy the outstanding view. We will visit Gosman’s Dock, a combination working fishing port, pleasure boat dock, and shopping area. We will have time to visit shops, enjoy lunch (on your own). Next we will visit Duck Walk Vineyard in Water Mill.

Back to Riverhead, freshen up prior to dinner then enjoy Insatiable Eats. Indulge an apertif plate and taste unique treats of Italy.

**THURS** Meet your guide in the lobby after breakfast and discover the village of Southhampton. See some of the most elaborate homes and mansions in America, owned by the elite. If time permits, we will stop by Cooper’s Beach which is on the list of the top ten beaches in the country. Then we are off to Sag Harbor which was one of the main ports of entry into the USA in the late 1700s. Our tour will include a stop at Sag Harbor Whaling Museum and the Old Whalers Church. Enjoy lunch (on your own) in town.

We will spend a bit of time on two ferries. We will depart Sag Harbor, cross Shelter Island, and experience our first boat ride on the South Ferry and North Ferry and land in the seaside village of Greenport. There will be some time to sightsee in the village. Our next stop is Harbes Family Farm, a North Fork destination where you can enjoy fresh vegetables or award-winning wines. Savor a wine tasting and then wander while you shop.

Dinner will be presented at the Touch of Venice Restaurant in Cutchogue, located on North Fork. Be prepared for a veritable feast.

**FRI** Check out of the hotel after breakfast and board the coach. As we head west to leave the island we have time for one more visit, the Old Westbury Gardens. They are considered one of the most beautiful English-style gardens in North America. The gardens encompass 160 acres of beauty that changes with the seasons. Our visit will include the formal gardens, fields, lakes, woodlands, and ponds. Also included will be a tour of the Westbury House, the 1996 John S. Phipps family mansion.

**LEAVE NEW YORK** for our trip home to Damascus with stops along the way.

### Shanksville, Pennsylvania

**Tour Leader – Joanne Kessler – Thursday, September 4, 2025**



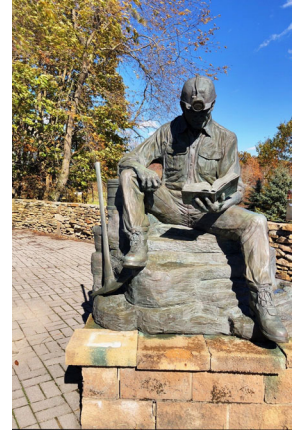
This trip is the story of the Flight 93 on September 11, 2001, It will be 24 years since this horrific day in American history. The trip includes the Tower of Voices, Visitor's Center and Museum, and the Wall of Names. If you have not visited this site, some and learn the stories as we pay homage to all of them. You will not forget your visit.

We will also visit the site of the nine coal miners rescued at Quecreek in 2002, and the saints that saved them. Shanksville,

Pennsylvania, lies on the Stoney Creek which is designated a Pennsylvania Scenic River as it rolls from its headwaters to the State Game Lands. Less than a year later, about 15 miles from the crash site, nine coal miners at Quecreek Mine site were trapped after mining activities breached an adjacent mine filled with water. This picture-perfect community showed everyone selfless actions that affected the whole world.

The trip includes transportation, time at the Flight 93 Memorial, Tour of Quecreek Mines, Lunch at the Coal Miner's Café, all taxes and tips, including the driver.
